Thubrick was in Town a few days ago, but before I received the last parcel of yours & expressed a seemingly sincere wish that the matter might be brought to an amicable adjustment" \_ doub forget China for these good folks Mrs & - says she wants common china that will do for the afternoon on Fra parties -
