Philadelphia Sept. 5th 1793 I got safely to Town between twelve I one & found every thing well at our house -I have made every enquiry respecting the contagious disorder that the shortness of the time add would admit _ the reports are not uniform_ the result of my enquires is - That there is an abatement in the malignancy of the disorder and that the Physicians seem to understand it betterbut that as great a number are sich as have been at any time & that it is more ypread -I don't know one of your acquaintance that have died - the alarm is considerable & Jum happy you & Peter are out of Town Mylor Meade I the Millers - old Me Me Call IM Bat are all at home shows no apprehensions _

I inclose you a letter from Jackson _ my fears are realised - he is gone into confinement-Barnwell & Mr Viller Ramsay desire their bish respects to you -I shall come to see you I think on Sunday shall I bring Betsy up with me? M.Enh is very sich but not with this hever as the term is -Diffutchinson is yet alive - but very low -Si Rush has cured 8 out of 12 that hopes of the other 4 - he was Mercury copiously -Kiss Peter for me Her assured that Just every precaution to preserver your hurband
