A BILL

To amend section 620 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to suspend, in whole or in part, economic and military assistance and certain sales to any country which fails to take appropriate steps to prevent narcotic drugs produced or processed, in whole or in part, in such country from entering the United States unlawfully, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That section 620 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22
4 U.S.C. 2370) is amended by adding at the end thereof the
5 following new subsection:

1 “(v) The President shall suspend (in whole or in part)
2 economic and military assistance provided under this or any
3 other Act, and shall suspend (in whole or in part) sales
4 under the Foreign Military Sales Act and sales under title I
5 of the Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act
6 of 1954, with respect to any country when the President de-
7 termines that the government of such country has failed to
8 take appropriate steps to prevent narcotic drugs (as defined
9 by section 4731 of the Internal Revenue Code) produced or
10 processed, in whole or in part, in such country from entering
11 the United States unlawfully. Such suspension shall continue
12 until the President determines that the government of such
13 country has taken appropriate steps to carry out the purpose
14 of this subsection. In implementing the provisions of this
15 subsection, the President is authorized to utilize such agencies
16 and facilities of the Federal Government as he may deem ap-
17 propriate to assist foreign countries in their efforts to pre-
18 vent the unlawful entry of narcotic drugs into the United
19 States. The President shall keep the Congress fully and cur-
20 rently informed with respect to any action taken by him
21 under this subsection. Nothing contained in this or any other
22 Act shall be construed to authorize the President to waive the
23 provisions of this subsection.”.
