A BILL

To prohibit nepotism in employment in the legislative branch of the United States Government.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That for purposes of this Act—
- 4 (1) A "Member of the Congress of the United States"
- 5 means an elected Member of the United States House of
- 6 Representatives, the United States Senate, and the Resident
- 7 Commissioner of Puerto Rico.
- 8 (2) A "relative" means any person who is related to a
- 9 Member of Congress as father, mother, son, daughter, brother,
- 10 sister, uncle, aunt, first cousin, wife, niece, nephew, father-
- 11 in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, step-

- 1 father, stepmother, stepson, stepdaughter, stepbrother, step-
- 2 sister, foster parent, or foster child.
- 3 Sec. 2. (a) A Member of Congress shall not appoint
- 4 or employ, or recommend for appointment or employment
- 5 to a position, in any capacity in the legislative branch of the
- 6 Federal Government, any person who is a relative of such
- 7 Member of Congress.
- 8 (b) Any relative appointed or employed in violation of
- 9 this section shall not be entitled to compensation, and no
- 10 money shall be paid from the Treasury of the United States
- 11 as compensation to any relative so appointed or employed.
