Mr. ROONEY of Pennsylvania (for himself, Mr. MULTER, Mr. SCHEUER, Mr. EILBERG, Mr. HELSTOSKI, Mr. VIGORITO, Mr. MADDEN, Mr. ADDABBO, Mr. HARRISON, Mr. ANNUNZIO, Mr. BINGHAM, Mr. GIBBONS, Mr. SANDMAN, Mrs. DWYER, Mr. NELSEN, Mr. CAHLL, Mr. BROYHILL of Virginia, Mr. GONZALEZ, Mr. HALL, Mr. KORNEGAY, Mr. KARTH, Mr. MOORHEAD, Mr. BLATNIK, Mrs. GREEN of Oregon, and Mr. MATSUNAGA) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce

A BILL

To amend the Nurse Training Act of 1964 to provide for increased assistance to hospital diploma schools of nursing.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 That section 806 of the Public Health Service Act is

4 amended to read as follows:

5 "SEC. 806. (a) In order to prevent further attrition

6 and promote the development of public and nonprofit private

7 diploma schools of nursing, there are hereby authorized to

8 be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for the

1 fiscal year ending June 30, 1968, and for the four succeed-
2 ing years to defray a portion of the cost of training students
3 of nursing.

4 “(b) From the amounts appropriated pursuant to sub-
5 section (a), the Surgeon General shall pay to each public
6 or nonprofit diploma school of nursing for each fiscal year
7 in the five-year period beginning July 1, 1967, an annual
8 grant of \$12,000 for a full-time student enrollment of fifty or
9 fewer, \$15,000 for a full-time student enrollment of fifty-one
10 to one hundred, \$18,000 for a full-time student enrollment of
11 one hundred and one to one hundred and fifty, \$21,000 for
12 a full-time student enrollment of one hundred and fifty-one
13 to two hundred, and \$24,000 for a full-time student enroll-
14 ment of two hundred and one or more; an annual grant not
15 to exceed \$6,000 on a 50 per centum-50 per centum match-
16 ing basis for library resources, and an annual grant of \$400
17 per full-time student. The Surgeon General shall make such
18 amounts available to those diploma schools of nursing as
19 approved by the appropriate State agency.

20 “(c) For the purposes of this section, a diploma school
21 of nursing shall be deemed accredited upon approval by the
22 appropriate State agency recognized by the Surgeon General.

23 “(d) That an annual grant of such sums as may be nec-
24 essary on a 75 per centum-25 per centum Federal-State
25 matching basis be made toward the establishment and opera-

1 tion of a State comprehensive planning committee for nurs-
2 ing education. Such committee shall be appointed by the
3 appropriate officer of each State and its membership shall
4 include equal representation from baccalaureate associate
5 degree and diploma schools of nursing. Such committee
6 should develop a State master plan for nursing education
7 which includes consideration of the following objectives:

8 "1. avoid costly duplication of programs;

9 "2. insure strategic location of new, expanding pro-
10 grams;

11 "3. create and maintain balance among various
12 kinds of educational programs;

13 "4. provide a balanced supply of all kinds of nurses
14 needed;

15 "5. determine statewide needs for nursing personnel
16 of all kinds on a succession of target dates;

17 "6. plan an educational system which will provide
18 the needed personnel, with specific recommendations
19 about individual institutions and their capacities;

20 "7. recommend the means of attracting students and
21 sources of financial support for capital and operating
22 expenses of programs;

23 "8. maintain continued planning and evaluation of
24 progress.

25 "(e) For the purpose of this section, the full-time en-

rollment in any school shall be determined as of February 15 of each fiscal year.”
