SHIPPED, in good Order and well conditioned, by *Mr. Stephens*
in and upon the good Schooner called the *Olivia & Mary*
whereof is Master for this present Voyage
Florence Donovan — and now lying in the Port
of *Savannah* — and bound for *Philadelphia*
to lay,

Five Tices of Rice —
— — — — —
— — — — —

being marked and numbered as in the Margin, and are to be delivered in the like
good Order, and well conditioned, at the aforesaid Port of *Philadelphia*
(the Danger of the Seas only excepted) unto *Mr. John Keane* —

or to *his Assigns*, he or they paying Freight for the said Goods, *Rice* at
the rate of One & a half Dollar per Tice

with Primage and Average accustomed. In Witness whereof the Master or Purser of
the said Schooner hath affirmed to *three* Bills of Lading, all of this Tenor
and Date; the one of which *three* Bills being accomplished, the other *two* to
stand void. Dated in
