I am extremely glad that my beloved got to the end of her journey without any accident & partake of your pleasure in the most sensible manner, which I know must have been almost inexpressible_ I beg you not to hurry home but stay + recruit yourself from your fatigue, the country air & exercise will be serviceable to you_ Peter & I make our very well his fondness for going to school is not yet worn away_ Celia & Jacob have every thing in order for me_ I have Peter in my room at night & he is a quiet without Sarah as with her_

Our neighbour Meade is very kind_ he would make me take a family dinner with him yesterday no excuse would do_ he would have dinner precisely at [at] two o'clock_ I should go when I pleased _& he would have any thing got that I chose_ he gave me some very fine spruce beer which I praised + enquired where it was to be procured_ they brewed it at [at]

home_ but I should have [it] when I pleased_ and to day sent me four bottles_ he has let [let]¹ the house we are in for 200 dols a year that is 40 dols more than we give_

Pleasants has told Franks that we shall have the refusal of the house where Anderson is__

Tell Mr. Jackson I am very much obliged to him for his invitation to Punch it_ but if he will skip here I will treat him to spruce beer_ my love to him + every body_ especially your Father to whom say every thing respectful & dutiful_ Peter sends you a thousand kisses_ I told him yesterday that you + every body at Abyssinia sent him a kiss he demanded them & would not let one be forgotten_

give rosy health to you & yours_
