Advising Students Interested in Health Professions

Students in many undergraduate majors are interested in careers in health professions such as Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Physician Assistant. Topics addressed will include: transition issues related to the discontinuation of the pre-PT and pre-OT "tracks" that were previously options in many of Kean's undergraduate major programs; advising students about aligning their undergraduate study with career plans, with emphasis on the importance of completing pre-requisite courses required for application to graduate programs; and updates on the development of new graduate programs at Kean, including the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program, as well as new undergraduate options in the College of NAHS.

Accountability and Service Form Workshop

A conversation with the Council of Deans on the implementation of the new faculty Service and Accountability Records.

Blackboard Training-Mashups/Calendar

This training has two parts, mashups and calendar. (1) Mashups: In this training participants will learn how to use mashups on Blackboard. At the end of the training participants will be able to add course content using mashups, and search appropriate mashup content online. (2) Calendar: In this training participants will learn how to set up and manage calendar on Blackboard. At the end of the training participants will be able to customize calendar, create, edit and delete events on calendar, and integrate Blackboard calendar with Google calendar.

Blackboard Training-Tests and Surveys

In this training participants will learn how to set up and manage tests and surveys on Blackboard. At the end of the training participants will be able to set up tests and surveys, design tests and surveys questions, create and utilize question pools, and collect and analyze test and survey results. Participants are required to bring three written multiple-choice questions and two essay questions to this training. Presenter: Matthew Mongelli

Ethics Requirements for Kean University for Faculty and Staff

This session will satisfy the mandatory ethics training requirement for State executive branch employees. This program will examine ethics requirements for Kean University faculty and staff. The course will cover the Conflicts of Interest Law, N.J.S.A. 52:13D-12 et seq.; ethics rules, N.J.A.C.19:6.1 et seq.; the Uniform Ethics Code; and the Kean University Supplemental Ethics Code. The presentation will focus on specific ethics areas most likely to affect university faculty and staff, including compliance with ethics rules regarding gifts, attendance at events, outside activities, secondary employment, political activity and conflicts of interest. Ethics requirements will be illustrated with case studies from the files of the New Jersey State Ethics Commission that address common ethics dilemmas. The program will also include a discussion of additional ethics standards applicable to faculty members acting in a scholarly capacity. The scholarly capacity rules provide exceptions allowing for the acceptance of honoraria, academic prizes and compensation for published works and guidelines for documentation and reporting such acceptance.


Update on Online Learning
