Session Descriptions and Presenters

Academic Program Annual Assessment Report: Revisiting the Purpose, Process and Characteristics of a Quality Report

This session is primarily for the Assessment Coordinators of academic programs. Although submitting an assessment report at the end of the academic year has become an annual activity at Kean University, both new and veteran program Assessment Coordinators would benefit by revisiting this important topic especially now as the University is starting to prepare for the Middle States Self-Study. The focus will be redirected to the purpose, continuous improvement of the program. It is the process articulated through the assessment reports that demonstrate how improvements are made.

Course Evaluations Reports: How to Utilize Them for Improvement?

This session is designed for faculty members to help understand course evaluation reports. With the switch over to CampusLabs powered platform, the reports are available only online but provide a variety of ways to look at the results and interpret them. Additionally, faculty members will also be provided with some resources and ideas to utilize the results to improve teaching effectiveness.

Creating Courageous and Brave Space

For the third consecutive year, the FBI reports that New Jersey has an increase in hate crimes. The vast majority of these crimes are based on race or ethnicity. Talking about race and diversity matters remains a challenge for individuals from multiple backgrounds. In addition to race, conversations about religion, sexual orientation, gender expression, class, immigration are just as complex.

To bridge the gaps across these cultural divides, individuals need courageous and brave spaces for open and honest dialogue. Bold spaces are created by individuals willing to confront fear, expose vulnerability, and commit to the arduous practice of unlearning bias attitudes and behaviors.

Dialogue is more than mere conversation. It is a tool to create empathy, shared meaning, deep understanding and collaborative learning among individuals. Dialogue assumes that two markedly different perspectives may coexist at the same time and, therefore, rejects binary thinking. Dialogue requires participants to establish, protect, and maintain a culture of mutual trust. Participants recognize their ways of thinking and behaving may be influenced by their engagement or lack of engagement with others. Through dialogue, we realize two vastly different viewpoints can feel "true" at the same time. This revelation requires individuals to reject simplistic, binary thinking. Dialogue invites us to learn about

ourselves and others, so we are free to change our minds as we re-imagine and unlearn ideas that no longer serve us.

This session will provide participants with the opportunity for critical self-reflection and personal action planning to create environments that embrace diversity. This session will offer the participants a chance to practice the communication skills required in brave spaces to address diversity, equity, and inclusion. Program and School Curriculum Committees are strongly encouraged to meet the week of January 6 to prepare documents for these meetings. Committee members should contact their respective Chairperson for meeting details.
